

From Fr. Richard and Fr. Paddy


In light of the reduction of clergy serving the Glasnevin Grouping since the summer, the declining number of parishioners regularly attending Mass, and the emphasis on providing quality Liturgy, the clergy and pastoral councils of the five parishes in the Glasnevin Grouping have been meeting in recent months to discuss the consolidation of Mass times across the Grouping on Sundays and weekdays.

The main effect for parishioners of St. Columba parish is that there will no longer be a weekday Mass on Tuesday mornings at 9.30am. Each of the five parishes will have at least one day in the week, when there is no mid-morning Mass. On Mondays, it will be Ballygall; Tuesdays: Iona Road; Wednesdays: Drumcondra; Thursdays: Glasnevin, and Fridays: Ballymun Road. On Tuesdays, parishioners in Iona Road are invited to attend Mass in Our Lady of Dolours at 10.00am, Corpus Christi at 10.00am or at St. Alphonsus convent at 5.45pm.

There will be no change to the weekend Mass times in Iona Road: Saturday 6.00pm and Sunday 11.00am.

These changes are due to come in across the Grouping from Sunday 1st December (First Sunday of Advent). However, since both Fr. Paddy and Fr. Richard will be away for the first two weeks in November, it was felt that it made more sense to anticipate the changes by starting the week beginning Monday, 4th November.

We thank parishioners in advance for your cooperation with implementing these necessary changes and apologize for any inconvenience caused.
