

Marie Keogh (St. Columba's N.S.)

On the 15th of May 2018, our lives in St. Columba's were changed forever, when we received the terrible news that our friend and colleague Marie was gravely ill and was not expected to recover.

Marie joined our staff in November 1996. She worked with four principals, Sr. Germaine, Ms. Regina Murphy, Mrs. Mairéad Shiel and Ms. Eileen Whelan. Marie received a warm welcome from each of them and they and the rest of the staff valued her expertise, professionalism, caring nature and friendship.

Marie was the best known staff member in the school. She was the first person parents and children met when they were enrolled in the school and she often met our future pupils while they were still babies in buggies. When the girls graduated in 6^{th} class and then returned to the school as visitors. Marie was always the first person to greet them on their way in, and she had an extraordinary recall of their names. Marie loved to meet the next generation too, when past pupils returned, to enrol their own children for Junior Infants. She was so fond of her 'Mammies' in the school and over the course of eight years or more she got to know them very well.

Marie loved her 'shop ladies' and she enjoyed a little chat with them early in the morning when she had time. Her office was always busy first thing, as she sorted any little problems the children had – forgotten lunches/ dancing shoes / missing recorders/ phone calls home etc.

At Marie's funeral Mass the whole school community was very anxious to support her husband Séan and children Ann-Marie and Derek in whatever small way we could. Four symbols were brought to the altar to represent Marie's life in St. Columba's. The first symbol was the Communion and Confirmation Booklets which represented Marie's absolute devotion and love for her work, and the care and thought she put into everything she did and everybody she met. The second symbol was the school jersey which represented the attentiveness, interest and concern Marie showed to all the pupils of St. Columba's, past and present. The third symbol was a CD which represented Marie's love for all things musical. A Dublin jersey was the fourth symbol, illustrating Marie's passion for the Dublin team. Marie took huge pleasure from the 'annual visit' of the team in the last few years.

We at St. Columba's have suffered a terrible loss and yet the grief felt by her lovely husband Séan, children Ann-Marie and Derek, and her extended family is even greater again. We at St. Columba's, will never forget our good friend Marie and as a community we extend our heartfelt sympathies to the Keogh family. Ar dheis Dé go raibh a hanam.
