We live in a stone-throwing society which cares little for the circumstances that cause people to make wrong choices. We want someone to blame, and the sooner the better. Those who accuse others often do so from a lack of selfknowledge and laziness, because it is very easy to be negative. We have all had a part to play in creating climate injustice, but the blame game won't solve the issue. We need to be proactive *this dignity* and challenge complacency on this issue which is wherever we see it

We make mistakes but we can always ately to those who are in difficulty we can rediscover our common humanity.

Yet all is not lost. Human beings, while capable of the worst, are also capable of ing to trick Jesus. We may wonder what rising above themselves, choosing again what is good, and making a new start, despite their mental and social conditioning ... No system can completely suppress our openness to what is good, true and beautiful, or our God-given ability to

> respond to his grace at work deep in our hearts.

I appeal to evervone throughout the world not to forget ours.
