IMPORTANT NOTICE

We are all aware of the growing concern in Ireland with regard to the Covid-19 virus, and the new guidelines from the government in An Taoiseach's statement yesterday. There have also been statements from the Conference of Irish Bishops and from Archbishop Diarmuid Martin last evening.

In light of the emphasis on care for the common good and especially for those most vulnerable in all three statements, the insistence that indoor mass gatherings not exceed one hundred people, and the message from the bishops that all are dispensed from the obligation of physically attending Sunday Mass, we, in the Glasnevin Grouping, have drawn the conclusion that it would be unwise to go ahead with the public celebration of Mass in our churches this Sunday, on St. Patrick's Day, and on future Sundays until further notice. We believe that it would be impossible to enforce or guarantee that fewer than 100 people would attend any Saturday Vigil or Sunday Mass, and that allowing Mass to proceed might unintentionally put pressure on vulnerable parishioners to attend.

We draw the attention of parishioners to the fact that they can follow Mass from their home on the webcam from Ballygall (www.ballygallparish.ie) on Saturday at 6.30pm, St. Alphonsus Monastery (www.rednuns.com) on Sunday at 9.30am or Iona Road (www.ionaroadparish.ie) on Sunday at 11.00am. Alternatively they can follow Mass on RTE radio or on the EWTN channel on television.

The Churches in the Glasnevin Grouping will remain open for private prayer from Monday-Saturday and the schedule of weekday Masses will continue until further notice.

All other parish meetings, including the Lenten lecture series in the Margaret Aylward Centre, are cancelled until further notice.

Even if we cannot gather physically for Mass on Sunday, we can continue to be united in faith and in prayer, especially for all those affected by the virus and all frontline health care workers. We remain available to assist parishioners at all times.
