

# Last Sunday, I answered five questions that I have been asked recently.

#### Do I mind children playing around the church?

No, but supervision is important. Yes, if children – and older people - are playing football or hurling against the wall of the church.

A window was damaged last week. Since children play around the church, dog owners, please take care.



#### What happened 74?

74 Iona Road was a residence for a curate in the parish. It is now occupied by a priest chaplain in a hospital. The Diocese proposed to buy the house from the parish and after discussion at the Parish Pastoral Council and with the Parish Finance Committee, this was accepted. The house was professionally valued and after allowance deducted for recent renovations by the Diocese and allowance given for rent, the parish received €670,000.



The overdraft of  $\in 100,000$  has been cleared. We must take special care of our church, now almost 110 years old. We must continue supporting the ordinary collections, especially the **Family Offering**, which is the main parish means of income.



Fund-raising must continue as it would be wrong to start eating into capital.

#### What about the weekday Mass going back to 10 o'clock?



This is a wider issue now that we are working within a Group of five parishes. Ending up with five parishes all having weekday Mass at 10 o'clock might not be the best idea. Allowance must be made for the priests to substitute for one another. As a sign of the times, unfortunately, we may not always be able to have a weekday Mass every day.

#### What about the seats?

Before we make any decision, we must solve the many areas of damp around various places in the church. They have been treated, and hopefully cleared but redecoration is not advised for the present. We have been asked to look at the sanctuary area, principally from a safety aspect but also to assess the space generally. This may have consequences for seating arrangements. My greatest concern is that we don't have Sunday congregations big enough to fill the seating we have.


