



#### **Clareville Centre** celebrated



### **GLASNEVIN GROUPING OF PARISHES Planned PILGRIMAGE TO OBERAMMERGAU** 16 – 20 JUNE 2020

The town of Oberammergau, located about 100 km south of Munich in Bavaria, Germany is famous for its 380-year tradition of the performing the Passion Play every 10 years and 2020 will be its 42<sup>nd</sup> performance.

### **Origins:**

The Passion Play of Oberammergau dates back to 1633 when Bavaria was ravaged by the plague epidemic and many lives were lost. The local elders vowed that if the lives of the villagers were spared, they would enact a play depicting the story of Christ's suffering, dving and resurrection which



would be performed every 10 years. Miraculously no further lives were lost. In 1634 the villagers fulfilled their solemn promise for the first time and ever since they have faithfully kept their vow. The Play:

The play portrays the Passion of Christ from the entry into Jerusalem to the Resurrection, in the 4,400-seat capacity Theatre. The presentation is so realistic that it is easy to imagine oneself at the foot of the cross or in the Garden of Gethsemane, the action interspersed Old Testament of Messianic prophesies set to music and sung by large choirs.

The incredible stage lighting and stunning special effects make the audience feel they are part of something truly special.
