A Note from Fr Paddy

Some weeks ago I mentioned that, while repairing slates on the roof of the church, damaged or blown off in the earlier storms, some other work that needs to be done was brought to our attention. An inspection and the initial repair work have been carried out under the supervision of the Properties division in the Finance Secretariat of the Diocesan Offices. Also, as mentioned previously, the inspection includes drains and gutters and more seriously, several areas of dampness damage in the interior of the church. When the report is available and before we reach a time for making some decisions, all of this will be placed before the parish and before the Parish Pastoral Council and our Finance Committee.

I have mentioned also some concerns about the sanctuary area of the church. Having worked most of my life in liturgy, it is not surprising that this particular aspect of our church building should command my attention! Lighting and sound need examination but, more seriously, are safety issues. Many of us find the marble floor and the several steps a little unnerving. We are seeking advice on this, a serious matter.

Summer time is with us and, thank God, with many very fine days already. It offers a break for our music groups but that does not necessarily mean that we cannot have singing at our Masses. Every weekday we sing Alleluia and the Amen at the end of the Eucharistic Prayer. That Amen, often called the Great Amen, is our most important acclamation as it is our assent to the great prayer of thanksgiving, the Eucharistic Prayer. Incidentally we have been standing for the first part of the Prayer, that is, the Preface. This is the appropriate posture, as given in the Missal, as we name a particular reason to lift up our hearts and to give thanks to the Lord our God. Let the congregation at our Sunday Masses be our summer choir!

Enjoy the summer. Take care, especially on the roads and in water.

May it be a time of peace and refreshment.
