A Note from Fr Paddy

It's a long note this time, based on discussions at our Parish Pastoral Council, Parish Finance Committee and Liturgy Committee where a number of areas have been identified that we must attend to and a wish list that we might work on. This is also an invitation to join in the conversation.

The first group that must receive attention:

REGULAR CONGREGATIONS at Sunday and weekday Mass, providing well for their worship and prayer, providing, where possible, for their social needs and activities.

Three groups that must receive our attention:

YOUNG PEOPLE must be invited into community and parish life by the community and parish providing something attractive to be part of.

NEW COMERS must be welcomed and receive information on the parish as well as been invited to be involved.

HOUSEBOUND must be included by been visited, cared for, kept in touch with parish through radio, webcam and, above all, through other people.

A WISHLIST that might be part of our parish vision, though it requires refining, finance, consultation, diocesan approval, prioritising and decisions:

A MEETING SPACE, looking realistically at a range of possibilities from a new building to a modest designated space within the church building.

At the ENTRANCE OF THE CHURCH, a sense of welcome, hospitality, with facility for tea and coffee, and plenty of information on display boards and electronically. This could also include an attractive devotional space, with shrines and candles.

Addressing the SAFETY concerns regarding the sanctuary of the church. The solution may include developments within the present space which would enhance its use in worship, a greater level plain or platform eliminating the many steps and dangerous marble floor. But it might also affect the present arrangements of altar, ambo, chair and elements that are part of the history of the church but not used, like the pulpit and altar rails. And it might include the use of the transepts so that the congregation would be a gathering around the altar.

Aspects of HOSPITALITY and GATHERING SPACE that may not be addressed above, such as coffee morning facility, bookshop, small meetings area, for existing groups like Active Retirement and for new groups.

WHEELCHAIR FACILITIES include toilet, spaces for wheelchairs in the body of the church. This probably would include an assessment of the sacristy space, existing toilet facility and parish office.
