Discussion on 'Discerning Our Vocation" 7pm, Wednesday, 7th September in lphonsus Monasterv welcome, especially young adults. Patrician Discussion p is organised by the Legion of Mary, Columba's Parish, Iona Rd.

The pilgrimage to Armagh last Monday, which was led by the Parish Priest, was an outstanding success. The Anglican cathedral is on the site of a church founded by St. Patrick in the year 445 and is also the resting place of Brian Boru whose body was brought there after the Battle of Clontarf in 1014. The Dean gave a wonderful tour and pointed out that all the bishops, right up to the Reformation, were the same as those listed in the Catholic Cathedral. The Lady Chapel was much admired. The Catholic Cathedral, a very large19th century building, took a long time to complete, as the funds to build the cathedral were diverted to famine relief. The Tour Guide, Mrs. Lily Clifford, came out to the coach to welcome the pilgrims and in addition to the tour of the cathedral also included the burial places of the Cardinals. The two cathedrals are built on hills overlooking the city. Morning coffee and dinner were in the Carrigdale Hotel outside Newry and the sun shone until evening.
