



Traditionally, we have found it easy to think of the Cross as the measure of God's love for us. Because of the focus on the Cross, we find it more difficult to think of the Resurrection as also the love of God, perhaps "all the more so"! The originality of the Fourth Gospel says it all: the disciple Jesus *loved*, the head cloth recalling Lazarus (see how much he loved him) and, not least, the great figure of Mary Magdalen (Mary!). In summary, Jesus died and rose again for love of us.

Easter is very early this year, though, we might remember that it was even two days earlier six years ago. Small wonder there is a debate going on in places wondering if it could be a fixed date, with the suggestion that Easter might be, for example, the second Sunday in April. We would have to wait until 10 April this year. On the other hand we could stay

with the date agreed at the Council of Nicaea in the year 325: the Sunday after the full moon which comes after the Spring equinox. The date is beyond our control! At this time we are marking the centenary of the Easter Rising of 1916, though in that year it was a very late Easter; Easter Monday was 24 April. As Christians we are celebrating the greatest feast of the year, indeed of all time. The journey of Lent is over and we have reached the holy mountain of Easter, celebrating the Death and Resurrection of the Lord.
