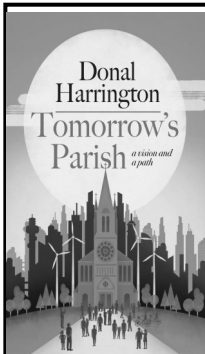

Nutrition Study at UCD

UCD Institute of Food and Health are running a new study called **A-diet Confirm.**

The study follows people's dietary habits and collects biological samples once a month over 4 months. This study looks for healthy, non-smoking volunteers, aged 18-60 years who are not on medication or supplements. Participants can find out about their body composition (muscle, fat and bone mass %) at each visit.

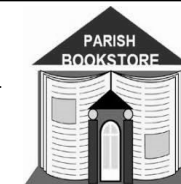
