A Note from Fr Paddy

'Who said the 11 o'clock Mass?'

The question might better be, 'Who celebrated the 11 o'clock Mass?' The liturgy is always the action of Christ, the Priest and we share in his Priesthood through Baptism. Therefore the question might be answered, 'We all celebrate ... all who gather at 11 o'clock and we do so, ''through [Christ], and with him, and in him,' Being active participants, being celebrants of worship, using the words of Vatican II, is our right and duty because of our Baptism. Before we exercise any other ministry, that ministry of being the assembly at worship is the most fundamental.
