

The Parable

- A "normal day" for the rich man
 - Add to his wealth...continue "good living"
 - Never noticed OR ignored Lazarus
- A "normal day" for Lazarus
 - How much more pain, misery, humiliation?
 - What "crumbs" (pity) will I get today?

Know the story? Recognise anyone in it?
