The church is open for Mass at 10.30am daily 9except Tuesday) and will remain open until 1.00pm each day.

As we are now gathering in the church again for Mass, we really appreciate your cooperation with the new protocols we have put in place for your safety and above all we want you to enjoy (safely) the great privilege of being back attending Mass in our beautiful church.

- You are asked to enter the church by the side door (ramp side) •
- To use the hand sanitisers available.
- To take a number from the table and proceed to your seat. (This is so we • can know how many persons are in the church)
- Your seat has been sanitised before you arrived and we ask that you sit at • least 2 metres from the nearest person to you. We ask you to observe the normal social etiquette if you need to cough or sneeze.
- You can stand and kneel for the various parts of the Mass as normal. •
- There will be 2 envelopes attached to each other in the seat in front of you; marked First Collection and Second Collection. If you would like to make a contribution to either or both of these please put the contribution into the relevant envelope and when the time comes you can pop both into the basket as it is brought to you. There will be no need for you to touch the basket.

At Communion:

- One of our ushers will advise you when to leave your seat to come up to • receive. Please wait until you are invited to leave your seat. You will approach the minister of the Eucharist from the middle aisle and return to vour seat via the side aisle, as normal.
- Hand sanitiser is provided at the top of the church so you can sanitise • before and after receiving communion if you would like to.
- You are encouraged to extend your arm fully to receive Communion. The • Minister of the Eucharist will do the same.
- The Priest and ministers will of course hand-sanitise before and after • Communion.

Before the final Blessing

- When the final hymn is over the ushers will again guide you when to leave • your seats – this allows us to leave efficiently and safely. You are encouraged to use the exit nearest to you as we will open all the doors of the church.
- You are asked to leave the number you were given on arrival on your seat, • as you leave. (This enables us to disinfect the used seats properly)
- Please also continue to follow government guidelines outside the church. •

All of the above plans are subject to change as we learn how to proceed in the coming weeks and again we thank you sincerely for your cooperation during these difficult times of change.

When we were obliged to close churches for the public celebration of Mass in early March because of Covid 19, who would have thought it would take another four months before we could open up again? As a Grouping of parishes we continued to celebrate Sunday Mass from this church and daily Mass from Ballygall. Nothing, however, compares with celebrating Mass with a live congregation. Already since Monday this week, it has been great to see familiar faces return to pray together. Perhaps after the enforced absence, we have a new



appreciation of the Eucharist as the source and summit of the Christian life. It is from this Sunday gathering together around the table of the Lord that we draw strength to live as Christ's disciples through the rest of the week. Our thanks to our parish steering committee, headed up by our parish secretary, Sheila, for their hard work in ensuring that we are ready to welcome you back again.
