Reflection for Sunday's newsletter/Parish Link:

The past number of years has seen a resurgence of a narrow form of nationalism across Europe and the US, which can find expression in a rejection of those whose culture, ethnic background or skin colour is different to our own. It is both fascinating and disturbing how Irish people can and have emigrated to North America and Australia in recent decades and created a life for themselves and their families there, and yet we are not always welcoming of those who come from other countries to do the same here. As this Sunday's readings make clear, in God's eyes, no one is a 'foreigner'. God's mercy and compassion embrace every human being, especially those in any kind of need, and as people of faith we are called to reveal the face of God to all. We can easily get caught up in our own cares and worries in this time of pandemic, but our thoughts and practical concern this week should be with the people of Lebanon, and especially Beirut, at this time of unprecedented suffering and need.


