

**Reflection:** Christmas trees have appeared in people's homes earlier this year, and the light displays outside seem more colourful than ever. It's as if after the year we have all been through, we have a greater need to raise the spirits and celebrate. This Sunday we will light the third (pink) candle on the Advent wreath, reminding us that it is Gaudete Sunday, an invitation to rejoice as we look forward to the celebration of the Nativity. John the Baptist is the central figure in this Sunday's Gospel, who sees his task as bearing witness to the light, Jesus the Christ. Advent invites us to journey with a new pep in our step, to allow ourselves be touched by the symbols and colours of this season, and to be moved to hope and to joy by the beautiful words of Isaiah: 'The spirit of the Lord has been given to me...he has sent me to bring good news to the poor, to bind up hearts that are broken'. Can we allow Christ be born anew in us this Advent, so that we can bear the light of his love, compassion and healing to those who are suffering.—Fr Richard Sheehy
