Reflection:

The readings this Sunday speak to us in a way that resonates all too well with our experience of living with the pandemic over the past year: looking out for tell-tale symptoms, having suspicions confirmed by someone in authority, fear of contagion, avoidance of physical contact, self-isolation or enforced quarantine. The focus in the first reading from Leviticus, third book of the Hebrew Torah, is on protection of the community. The fear response wins out. The Gospel, in stark contrast, shows Jesus responding to the needs of the individual whom he encounters. It is a response of compassion and love, and the outcome is healing. Every day, without even leaving our home, we will encounter situations where someone looks to us for acceptance, understanding, patience, encouragement, forgiveness, inclusion, generosity, all of which we can offer...if we want to.
