## Reflection

For the past year our whole way of life has been transfigured by the presence of the coronavirus. So many of the ordinary things of life have been interrupted, like going to school or work, visiting friends, playing sport or simply shopping. When did we last shake hands with someone? Many of those who have become infected have been left seriously compromised by the experience. But we have also seen a response of extraordinary compassion, especially among our health care professionals who have extended themselves not just to provide medical and nursing care but humanity and encouragement when patients' families and loved ones could not visit. Many of us have a heightened awareness of those in our community who may be isolated or vulnerable, and there are countless examples of people phoning up or shopping for neighbours living alone. Today's Gospel presents a very intimate scene, where Jesus's closest followers witness him being transfigured by the love of the Father. We know he will be transfigured later on the cross, though here too love ultimately triumphs over suffering. Lent is an invitation to us to take time to be apart, like Peter, James and John, to rest in the Father's love so that we too can be gradually transfigured into the likeness of Christ. 'Rabbi, it is wonderful for us to be here."
