
Reflection:

Resurrection faith begins in the dark. As the Gospel for Easter Sunday morning reminds us, it is not a blinding flash but a slow dawning. There is tension in John's account, with one disciple outrunning the other, and yet all they find is an empty tomb. It is only when they enter the tomb that, John tells us, they 'saw and believed'.

Resurrection faith only begins when we enter the tomb of our suffering. our experience of loss, setback, failure or rejection, and acknowledge our pain. It is only then that, like the disciples on the road to Emmaus, we can come to a new perspective and the possibility of new life opens before us. We have lived through a very difficult twelve months, where we have experienced restrictions on our movement and freedom which we could not have imagined a year previously. Many have lost their livelihoods, others have lost loved ones in difficult circumstances, others again experience isolation, and we all miss simply being with family members and friends. But we have also witnessed heroic and self-sacrificing care by many frontline workers, others reaching out to those who live alone; we have learned a new kindness and an appreciation for ordinary joys. With the anticipated acceleration of the vaccine roll out we can look forward to brighter days ahead. Christian faith is founded on the witness of the apostles that the cross of Good Friday is the way to Easter glory. Christ is risen! Alleluia, alleluia!

'It was very early on the first day of the week and still dark, when Mary of Magdala came to the tomb.' (John 20: 1)


