The annual parish Finance Statement for 2020 is published this weekend. We thank parishioners for your continued generous support of the parish, particularly during the past very challenging year.

In the last fifteen months, the necessary restriction of public worship has profoundly affected the two Sunday Mass collections. The first collection supports clergy ministering throughout the diocese as well as sick and retired priests. The second 'Share' collection supports diocesan services to parishes, especially disadvantaged parishes. In the last financial year, the first collection decreased by 54% and the 'Share' collection by 65%. This year saw a decrease of 80% and 86% respectively for the first quarter. To compensate for this decrease Archbishop Farrell has approved a proposal to hold a Summer Dues collection to support priests of the diocese. This initiative will follow the pattern of the Christmas and Easter dues collections, giving parishioners an opportunity to contribute to the income that supports priests. Summer Dues envelopes will be available at the back of the church throughout the summer months, and we thank parishioners and visitors in advance for your generous support of this new initiative.
