Reflection

It is often very quickly apparent from talking to people whether the glass in their lives is half full or half empty. Cultivating an attitude of gratitude for who we are and all that we have not only ensures that the glass is more than half full. It also helps us develop an awareness of God's presence and an openness to God's action in our lives. This is Mary's particular gift, expressed so well in the words of her Magnificat in this Sunday's Gospel: 'The Almighty has done

great things for me...'. We honour Mary, not simply as the Mother of Our Lord but as his most faithful disciple. Writing to the Corinthians, Paul expresses beautifully the resurrection theology of the Church. Since we believe that Christ is risen from the dead, 'the first fruits of all who have fallen asleep', so will all be brought to life through him, Mary enjoying pride of place among 'those who belong to him'. May we all be able to say with Mary: 'The Almighty has done great things for me'.
