Reflection

We probably think that the worship of idols is something which belongs to biblical times or at least to a past when people were less sophisticated. In this Sunday's First Reading, Joshua puts a stark choice to the tribes of Israel. They need to decide if they will serve the Lord or if they will serve the gods of their ancestors or of the Amorities whose land they have now taken possession of. We too have choices to make. Whether it's about tackling climate change, reception of refugees from Afghanistan or elsewhere into our country, or the distribution of Covid vaccines to those countries which have not yet received them, we need to decide which is more important: profitability, our own comfort, or the call to care for our neighbour in this and future generations? As Jesus puts it to the Twelve in the Gospel, working to make the values of the Kingdom of God a reality in our world demands hard choices, sacrifice and commitment: 'What about you, do you want to go away too?'
