Reflection: This Monday 20th September marks another step forward along the road of the government's roadmap for a gradual reopening of society and the economy, with many people being encouraged to return to work in their office rather than continuing to work remotely. In our churches too we are seeing a gradual easing of restrictions on numbers attending religious services, and after a considerable pause we are once again able to celebrate baptisms and weddings as well as First Communions and Confirmations. We look forward to soon having parish meetings with in person attendance rather than by zoom. While we welcome the direction in which we are moving, and we want people to feel more comfortable in attending our church, the challenge is to show our concern for one another by continuing to observe the restrictions which remain in place, particularly social distancing, hand sanitising on entering the church, and (adults) wearing a face mask. I want to take this opportunity to thank our sacristans, stewards, MCs, and baptism and funeral ministry teams who have ensured that we are welcomed and appropriately seated in the church and that the pews have been cleaned after each weekday and Sunday Mass. 

Mission Statement: St. Columba's parish is a vibrant and welcoming community of faith, continuing to give practical witness to the Good News of Christ, through worship and reflection, and through Christian service to the community.

We continue to welcome back parishioners to Mass this weekend on Saturday at 6pm and Sunday at 11.00am. Daily Mass is at 10:30am on Mon. Wed. Thurs and Fri.

We would like to remind parishioners of the following guidelines: -

- Since 6th September the 'pod' system is no longer operative during the celebration of Mass. This means that we can accommodate more parishioners and visitors who wish to attend Mass.
- As social distancing restrictions still apply, every second pew remains cordoned off, and we ask parishioners to keep a two metre distance in the pew unless sitting with family members.
- We respectfully remind parishioners to follow the directions of the stewards and the M.C. at Mass.
- Mass will continue to be streamed on the webcam for those who choose for the moment to continue to participate from home: www.ionaroadparish.ie
- The church remains open each day from 11.00am -3.00pm for private prayer.

We welcome Fr. Gareth Byrne to the Glasnevin Grouping. Gareth has recently been appointed by Archbishop Dermot Farrell as Moderator of the Diocesan Curia, based in Drumcondra. He has offered to assist the parishes of the Grouping on Sundays, and will celebrate initially a monthly Mass in Iona Road. He will celebrate the 11.00am Mass next Sunday 26th September.

We thank parishioners for your contributions to the First and Second Collections and to the Family Offering. Since we recommenced the celebration of Sunday Mass with in-person attendance a few months ago, we have presented those arriving at the church with two envelopes: one for each of the two collections at Mass. These have been placed at the same time in the collection basket when the collectors go around. In order to simplify procedures, those attending Mass are handed only one envelope as they enter the church. The amount placed in the envelope will be divided 60/40% between the First Collection (for the priests of the parish and of the diocese) and the Share Collection (which funds the diocesan services which support parish life and ministry). We appreciate your cooperation which this procedure.
