'What must I do to inherit eternal life?' Surely this is the question at the heart of all human existence. What is life about? What are we here for? How can I live life fully, wisely, fruitfully...? As we look forward to the easing of even more Covid related restrictions in the coming weeks, we might well ask ourselves what are the lessons that we learned during the pandemic that we would like to hold on to (perhaps learning to slow down, spend more time with loved ones, appreciate nature)? What is it that enhances the human experience of life? The man in this Sunday's Gospel seems to have everything going for him: youth, wealth, opportunity, even faithfulness to his religious beliefs....yet he senses intuitively that there is something fundamental missing in his life. He also senses that he will find what he is looking for in Jesus. However, when Jesus tells him that if he wants to discover fullness of life, he needs to free himself from his many attachments, he goes away sad.

Francis of Assisi, whose feast day we celebrated earlier this week, embraced the Gospel call to radical detachment so that he could enjoy the freedom and joy of life in Christ. He discovered that the more you give away, the more you receive.

Prayer of St. Francis of Assisi

Lord make me an instrument of Your peace Where there is hatred let me sow love. Where there is injury, pardon. Where there is doubt, faith. Where there is despair, hope.

Where there is darkness, light. Where there is sadness joy. O Divine master grant that I may never seek so much to be consoled as to console To be understood, as to understand. To be loved, as to love. For it is in giving that we receive, In pardoning that we are pardoned, And it's in dying that we are born... To eternal life. Amen.
