The readings this weekend remind us that the Church's **Reflection:** year is drawing to a close. Next Sunday, the last Sunday of the Church's vear celebrates Christ as universal King. A new liturgical year begins the following Sunday with the First Sunday of Advent. The liturgical year revolves around the mystery of Christ: his birth (Christmas), ministry (Ordinary time), passion (Lent), death (Holy Week), resurrection (Easter) and sending of his Spirit on the Church (Pentecost). As followers of Jesus Christ, our lives are called to revolve around him as well. Our readings speak of end times, but an ending is always at the same time a beginning. With Christ everything is new. No matter what wrong turns we make in life, we are always offered the possibility of a new beginning. This is true for relationships, both with God, with other individuals as with other nations. We are not bound by the hostilities of the past, but we can learn from them. At the ecumenical service in Glasnevin cemetery to mark Armistice day this week, involving the participation of ambassadors from France, Germany, Italy, Austria, Belgium, Canada, Australia, New Zealand and the UK, the following prayer was said: 'We commit ourselves to work in penitence and faith for reconciliation between the nations, that all people may together live in freedom, justice and peace.' 
