The Share Collection THIS weekend 27/28 November is for Sick & Indigent Room keepers Society, which is the oldest charity in Dublin founded in 1790.

This collection occurs on an annual basis and is in line with the Diocese's appreciation of the work of the Society. The

area between the canals represents traditional boundaries within which the Society originally carried out its relief work, an area that now represents only 18% of the parishes within the City and County of Dublin. We are particularly grateful to parishioner for their generosity to the Society in past years.

Over the past few weekends we distributed a letter encouraging parishioners from January 2022 to place their donations for both collections in an envelope which can then be placed in the collection basket. This will enable the parish to trace the contribution and claim tax back on it.
