**Reflection:** Two Christian virtues that feature strongly in this Sunday's readings are generosity and hospitality: the hospitality of the widow of Sidon towards the prophet Elijah, and the generosity of another poor widow observed by Jesus. Hospitality is not simply about the niceties of making someone welcome in your home. It is about the capacity to really open your heart in welcome to the other, to listen to them. One of the participants at the COP climate gathering of nations in Glasgow remarked this week that those who will be most affected by the decisions reached at the conference are not even born vet. Their voice will not be heard at the meeting. Can the world leaders present have the imagination to divine what they would say? Will the voices of the nations most threatened by climate change and of the climate activists both inside and outside the conference centre strike a chord in the hearts of governments so that they have the courage to commit to and deliver radical action? It would be easy for us to merely look on in a detached or even cynical way, but as people of faith perhaps our act of generosity is to pray that the Holy Spirit will guide the negotiations taking place for the future of humankind and of our planet.
