Reflection:

'Peace be with you' are the first words of the risen Jesus to the disciples who had denied and deserted him on Holy Thursday. Words of reconciliation which create the possibility for a new beginning. How many of us need to find peace in our lives with another person, either living or dead, or indeed with ourselves, with our past? Jesus words of forgiveness give us the courage to take a first step. Indeed it remains central to his mission: 'Those whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven'. For the people of Ukraine, peace seems a far off hope, as cities like Mariupol are bombed beyond recognition, and those who are fortunate enough to have found refuge in other countries worry about their loved ones who haven't. However far off it seems, we need to pray for an end to the terror and for the first moves towards a ceasefire and eventual peace.

At the Mass of Chrism on Holy Thursday Archbishop Dermot Farrell launched his Easter pastoral letter and the first phase of the **Building Hope** Initiative, which invites every parish in the diocese to participate in creating a diocesan plan for the future. 


