Reflection

We are on the cusp of Holy Week, the most solemn week in the Church year, when we relive the final days of Jesus of Nazareth, leading to his passion and death on Good Friday, and are called to reaffirm our faith that he is risen. The week begins with the blessing and procession with palms into the church on Palm Sunday and the reading of St. Luke's narrative of the Passion. On Holy Thursday at the Mass of the Lord's Supper, we commemorate the institution of the Eucharist and the commissioning of the disciples to service of one another. On Good Friday at 3pm, we gather for the solemn celebration of the Passion (this time St. John's account) and veneration of the cross. It is preceded by an outdoor Way of the Cross beginning at 12noon at the Margaret Aylward centre in the grounds of the Holy Faith convent on Glasnevin Hill. Stations of the Cross in the church will also be led at 7.30pm that evening. On Holy Saturday we gather at 9pm for our celebration of the Easter Vigil, beginning with the blessing of the Paschal fire outside the church. We are all too aware that our journey through Holy Week this year takes place in the context of the awful suffering being inflicted upon the country and people of Ukraine. How is it possible to proclaim Easter faith when we witness such inhumanity and depravity? For some of us too, our journey through Holy Week takes place against the background of more personal suffering: illness or bereavement. As we make this journey together, may we come to recognise the One who journeys with us. Fr. Richard Sheehy
