Reflection:

We have journeyed through Lent and are now entering the solemn days of the *Easter Triduum (three days), as we prepare to celebrate the Paschal mystery; the* Passion, death and resurrection of Jesus the Christ. As Church we do this in the various Holy Week liturgies, culminating in the celebration of the beautiful Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday night. As individuals, we brush against the Paschal mystery in our ordinary lives as we come up against the unexpected: illness, accident, loss of independence, bereavement, disruption, break up of a relationship. These experiences test us, but Easter invites us to renew and proclaim our faith in the Risen Christ, who never abandons us but accompanies us with compassion, giving us strength for whatever challenges we have to face. This year we celebrate Easter against the backdrop of the devastating war in Ukraine. As people of faith we can only pray for an end to the suffering of the *Ukrainian people and reach out in whatever practical way we can to assist the* refugees who have come to Ireland seeking safety and shelter. After the past two years of lockdown, it is a real joy to be able to celebrate this year our full programme of Holy Week ceremonies, which began already last Sunday with the blessing and procession of palms into the church and our reading of the passion narrative. It means that parishioners can experience the richness of the Easter liturgies, whether attending in-person or participating via webcam from the comfort of their home. We are an Easter people. May our faith and hope in Christ be renewed as we celebrate together, and may it find expression in our lives and in our outreach to others. Christ is risen. Alleluia! Alleluia! Fr. Richard
