## Reflection

The third day of a four day professional golf tournament is often described as 'moving day', when the eventual winner starts making his or her way up the leader board. This week many parishes celebrate graduation Masses for 6<sup>th</sup> class pupils preparing to move from primary to secondary school. This time of year is generally a time of transition, as second level students prepare for a new beginning at college, either at home or abroad, graduates prepare to enter the world of work or to take a 'gap' year, others again contemplate taking a career break to engage in further studies or to raise a family. For the majority of people it's a much needed opportunity to take a break from work or education and to take a family holiday.

When Luke tells us that 'Jesus resolutely took the road for Jerusalem', it is clear that this is not simply a vacation or change of location. Jesus is embracing his destiny, his sense of where life and God is calling him, even if that involves challenge, uncertainty, even suffering. This is a good time of year for us to examine the direction of our own lives. Are we living the life we are called to live? Are we moving in the direction of our own goals? As we prepare to enjoy some physical recreation and a break from the familiar routine, perhaps it's also a good time to reflect on our lives and where God may be calling us.
