"Martha, Martha. You worry and fret about so many things, and yet few are needed, indeed only one. It is Mary who has chosen the better part; it is not to be taken from her"

Hospitality down through the ages has had an important role in society. In the bible today Abraham & Sarah welcomed the strangers and were promised that within the year they, an elderly couple, would have a child of their own. In the Gospel Martha and Mary offer hospitality to Jesus on his journey. Like Martha we sometimes can get caught up in distractions and unlike Mary fail to recognise the Lord after all she has chosen the better part.
