On Sunday the 4th Sept. a beautiful prayer service of thanksgiving took place in Clonliffe college chapel to mark the closing of Holy Cross College Clonliffe. It was founded in 1859 as the Catholic diocesan seminary for Dublin by Cardinal Paul Cullen. In latter years the building was no longer used for training priests but it became the administration centre for the Dublin Diocese. As part of the celebration on the day a video was put together looking at the history of Holy Cross College.
