One of the most beautiful features of St Mel's Cathedral before the fire of Christmas 2009 was the beautiful Ray Carroll (1930-1994) painting of Jesus breaking bread with the disciples at Emmaus. The disciples have just recognised Him, The Lord is pointing back at the road, as if to say 'It was me, I was with you on the road and you didn't recognise me.' But there is also a sense that he's pointing at the road back to Jerusalem as if going on to say, 'Now that we have met here, have courage to go back to the place where you were.' Pilgrims always go home and the homeward step of the two disciples from Emmaus is joyful and upbeat. They are transformed by their encounter with the Risen Jesus.

We bring our disappointments our struggles and doubts to the table of the Eucharist and we ask Jesus to transform us in the encounter with Him that we might bring what we celebrate here into our lives. That as we pray so we will live —transformed as the bread—to be the Body of Christ today!


