At Sunday Mass during the month of May we sing one of the best loved hymns, **Bring flowers of the rarest**. It is a very popular recessional song and nobody leaves until it is over. Often published without any information of its composition, but an American musician Mary E. Walsh is credited with the date around 1871. Crowning hymn is given as a title recalling the image of Mary wearing a crown, which is found in the 5th century, both East and West. Later images have Mary, seated on a throne, dressed like a queen and surrounded by angels and saints. Christ is sometimes seen placing a crown on her head. The words are about spring, flowers and blossoms, in the pastoral setting of woodland, hillside, dale and vale – and, above all, about the Queen of the May. The hymn brings memories of going to the May devotions each evening of the month and having a May altar at home and in school. Words may vary slightly; the two verses here are as sung by Canon Sydney McEwan.



Bring flowers of the rarest, bring blossoms the fairest, from garden and woodland and hillside and dale; our full hearts are swelling, our glad voices telling Flowers of the Flower of the vale. Their lady they name thee, their mistress proclaim thee, ah! grant that thy children on earth be as true as long as the bowers are radiant with flowers, as long as the azure shall keep its bright hue.

O Mary, we crown thee with blossoms today, Queen of the Angels and Queen of the May


