On the day named after the sun, all who live in city or countryside assemble.

The memoirs of the apostles or the writings of the prophets are read for as long as time allows. When the lector has finished the president addresses us and experts us to

ished, the president addresses us and exhorts us to

imitate the splendid things we have read. Then we all stand and pray.

As we said earlier, when we have finished praying, bread, wine, and water are

brought up. The president then prays and gives thanks according to his ability, and

the people give their assent with an "Amen!" Next, the gifts over which the thanksgiving has been spoken are distributed, and everyone shares in them, while

they are also sent via the deacons to the absent brethren.

The wealthy who are willing make contributions, each as he pleases, and the collection is deposited with the president, who aids orphans and widows, those in

prison, and visiting strangers -in short, he takes care of all in need.

Justin said that this gathering takes place to remember the work of God's creation and on Sunday, Jesus our Saviour rose from the dead.

That is also why we assemble on Sunday .
