The Wedding Feast Mt 22:1-14

At some stage or other we have all been invited to a wedding. A family member, a neighbour, a friend or our 55th cousin that we have never met. We have many different reactions often dependent on our relationship with those getting married. What'll I wear? Who's going? Can I get out of going? Or perhaps the politics of the event. They didn't invite my noisy children but invited my sisters troop of kids. I'm not going!

The parable for today's gospel revolves around another wedding. Once again Jesus is using a parable to describe the Kingdom of Heaven. Three types of people were invited to the wedding or into a deeper relationship with God and the Kingdom of God. The first group had been invited but for various reasons refused to go. Keep up the good work.


