We have listened to parables told by Jesus over the past few Sundays. Each one had a challenge for the leaders of the time of our Lord. They provide the same challenge for us today. A vineyard has been entrusted to tenants by its owner. The tenants get greedy and try to take it over. At the end it is taken from them and given to others. Where do we fit in to this story?

In our Irish history books we learned about absentee landlords. Big tracts of land were given to Lord 'such a body' as a thank you for support in battle or some political favour. Some landlords were diligent and others not-so. Many absentee landlords, once they got sufficient income from their newly acquired estate, were quite happy. They weren't worried about how they got it once they had enough to fund the lifestyle to which they had become accustomed to.

Tenants lived subsistent lives and often barely eked out a living. They worked every hour that God sent them for little or nothing. Todays parable reflects on God's relationship with us. No expense spared. Lavished everything upon us. Entrusted us with looking after the earth and its people. Prophets were sent through the ages but rejected. Even his only son. The leaders of the day had him locked up and put to death. Can we, as Christians in a world often pulling away from God, remain faithful to him who is the keystone and not be drawn into the failures of each generation.

As the Synod in Rome got underway this past week are we praying for its success and an listening ear to the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit is alive and active. However we are often closed to the voice of God through the Holy Spirit. October is often known as the month of the Rosary. A Hail Mary, a decade or indeed a full rosary might be recited regularly and offered up for the Synod.
