Second Sunday of Lent—Mark 9:2-10

The Church has chosen the Transfiguration of Our Lord as a suitable Gospel reading for the second Sunday of Lent. As a foretaste of Our Lord's Resurrection, the glory of the Transfiguration sustains us in the hardship and trials of the penitential season and keeps our focus on the goal of our Lenten observances: to be on the mountaintop with Jesus, to see the divine light shining from His face and to experience the joy of God's glory. This is our goal during Lent and we will soon say, when we reach the glory of Easter, "it is wonderful for us to be here". The sacrifices of Lent will be worth it. Peter, James and John were taken away by Jesus, up a high mountain, where they could be alone by themselves. This temporary detachment from the world, from the comforts and routines of life, pays rich dividends. Time spent in prayer, with our phones switched off, is time well spent.

Just LENT 2

In the first reading this Sunday we hear about the sacrifice of Abraham. When we look at the life of Abraham it is clear he made many sacrifices in his life. He wandered in the desert for many years trying to find a home. The Gospel refers to Peter suggesting that three tents are set up. Tents are symbolic of God's permanent presence among us, but today our towns and cities have people sheltering in tents because they are homeless. We as a Christian community

are challenged to help them find a safe, permanent home, where they can truly feel God's permanent protecting presence. There is no social or moral justification for homelessness, but we can find solace and meaning in the Incarnation... The Son of God came into this world as a homeless person... The Son of God knew what it was to start life without a roof over his head." "We can find no social or moral justification, no justification whatsoever, for lack of housing. There are many unjust situations, but we know that God is suffering with us, experiencing them at our side. He does not abandon us."




